V4350 A. LINCOLN AND ME

Videocassette, P, 9 min, C, NUTMEG MEDIA, 2005.

A young boy finds inspiration in the life and legacy of Abraham Lincoln in this iconographic presentation of the book by Louise Borden.

V4376 ABRAHAM LINCOLN

Videocassette, P, 17 min, C, 100 E, 2003.

Traces the life of Abraham Lincoln from his childhood home in Indiana to his final days as president. Highlights Lincoln's honesty, intellect, compassion, and determination. From the American Heroes Series.

V8927 ABRAHAM LINCOLN - ANIMATED HERO...

Videocassette, P-I, 30 min, C, NEST, 1993.

Traces the career of our nation's 16th president--from the dark days of the Civil War to his final trip back to Springfield, Illinois after his assassination--and highlights "Honest Abe's" emancipation of the slaves.

V7411 ABRAHAM LINCOLN: NEW BIRTH OF FREEDOM

Videocassette, I-S, 30 min, C, IDOE,.

The life story of Abraham Lincoln - from his birth in 1809 in the Kentucky wilderness to his assassination in 1865 in Washington, D.C. Produced in historic detail at major Lincoln-related sites, including Lincoln City and Rockport in Indiana. Narrated by Barry Sullivan.

V7424 BLACK EASTER: ASSASSINATION OF LINCOLN

Videocassette, J-S, 50 min, C, TN, 1992.

A documentary that explains Lincoln's murder in the context of the Civil War. Written by Dr. William Hanchett, one of the nation's foremost authorities on the Lincoln assassination.

V5259 BOYHOOD OF ABRAHAM LINCOLN

Videocassette, P-I, 11 min, C, CORF, 1980.

Filmed in an authentically reconstructed village and home in Lincoln City, Indiana, this program recreates Lincoln's boyhood of near-poverty and long hours of hard work. Encouraged by his stepmother in his desire for learning, the boy Lincoln early developed those qualities of honesty, responsibility, humor, and a capacity for hard work which were to make him a great president.

V5978 CIVIL WAR, THE

Videocassette, I-J, 30 min, BW, ZENGER, 1985.

Introduces the causes, developments, and consequences of America's Civil War, giving an overview of the people and places involved in this turbulent period. Begins with a short introduction to the role of slavery in the conflict between North and South, focuses on the principal battles, and ends with the assassination of President Lincoln.

V6626 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 1

Videocassette, S, 99 min, C, PBS, 1989.

The Cause - 1861. Evokes the causes of the war, from the Cotton Kingdom of the South to the northern abolitionists who opposed it. Includes John Brown's raid at Harper's Ferry, the election

of Lincoln, the firing on Ft. Sumter, and more. Introduces Lincoln, Douglass, Lee, Grant, and a host of other vivid characters.

V6627 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 2

Videocassette, S, 69 min, C, PBS, 1989.

A Very Bloody Affair - 1862. Begins with political infighting in Lincoln's cabinet. During the episode, witness the battle of ironclad ships, partake of camp life, and watch slavery begin to crumble. Follow Ulysses S. Grant whose exploits come to a bloody climax at the Battle of Shiloh.

V6628 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 3

Videocassette, S, 76 min, C, PBS, 1989.

Forever Free - 1862. Charts the dramatic events that led to Lincoln's decision to set the slaves free. Includes the Battle of Antietam, the bloodiest day of the war, followed shortly by the brightest--the emancipation of the slaves.

V6632 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 7

Videocassette, S, 72 min, C, PBS, 1989.

Most Hallowed Ground - 1864. Sets the awesome spectacle of men at war against the gripping political drama of Lincoln's re-election campaign. Chronicles the cavalry exploits of Confederate General Nathan B. Forrest. Comes to a climax with Sherman's final battle at Atlanta--and ends with the story of the origin of Arlington Cemetery.

V6633 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 8

Videocassette, S, 69 min, C, PBS, 1989.

War is All Hell - 1865. The final offensives of the war begin, and some of the greatest scenes in American history unfold. Includes Sherman's March to the Sea, Lincoln's second inauguration, Lee's Army flees to Appomattox, surrender of Lee to Grant, and John Wilkes Booth's dream of vengeance for the South.

V6634 CIVIL WAR, THE - EPISODE 9

Videocassette, S, 68 min, C, PBS, 1989.

The Better Angels of Our Nature - 1865. Begins in the bittersweet aftermath of Lee's surrender and goes on to narrate the horrendous events of 5 days later when Lincoln is assassinated. Recounts the capture of John Wilkes Booth and considers the consequences and meaning of the Civil War.

V8292 EQUAL RIGHTS FOR ALL

Videocassette, P-I, 25 min, C, LIBRARY VIDEO, 1996.

Surveys the story of the Bill of Rights, the Abolitionists, Abraham Lincoln, the Emancipation Proclamation, Susan B. Anthony, and women's suffrage. Narrated by Irene Bedard. From the American History for Children Video Series. (cc)

V5202 INDIANA: MOMENTS OF OUR TIME

Videocassette, I-S, 12 min, C, ICH, 1981.

Short segments recount significant parts of Indiana history: Lincoln's Indiana boyhood; a pre-Civil War black settlement at Lyles Station; the interurban railways; the steamboats on the Ohio River; and the settlement of New Harmony.

V9829 LINCOLN AT GETTYSBURG - GETTYSBURG ADDRESS

Videocassette, I-S, 34 min, C, CHIP TAYLOR, 2001.

The battle of Gettysburg, a turning point in the Civil War, was one of the deadliest in American history. A new National cemetery was established, a dedication ceremony was planned, and Abraham Lincoln was asked to make a "few, appropriate remarks." His Gettysburg Address is one of the most important speeches in American history. This program is a tribute to the man and his message.

V9203 LINCOLN TRAIL, THE

Videocassette, I-S, 11 min, C, CC AUDIO-VISUAL, 1994.

Visits major Lincoln sites in Kentucky, Indiana, and Illinois. Follows the life of Abraham Lincoln from his birthplace in Hodgenville to his final resting place in Springfield. (Enhanced slide show on video.)

V6649 LINCOLN'S ASSASSINATION

Videocassette, J-S, 20 min, C, ZENGER, 1988.

Illustrations and still photographs from the period are combined to recount the events surrounding the conspiracy to assassinate President Lincoln. Explores the backgrounds and motivations of assassin John Wilkes Booth and his ragtag band of co-conspirators.

V7159 PIONEER DAYS IN INDIANA

Videocassette, P-S, 23 min, C, PUAV, 1982.

Gives viewers an idea of 19th century life in Indiana. Filmed in the Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial and the Fowler Pioneer Village, demonstrations show a variety of pioneer tools and activities. These include moving by oxen-powered wagon, clearing the land, plowing with a horse, preparing maple syrup, churning butter, carding and spinning wool, and more!

V9189 WASHINGTON, D.C.

Videocassette, P-I, 16 min, C, 100%, 1998.

Explains why our nation's founders decided to put our capitol city where they did, and how they planned and built it. Visits the Capitol Building, the White House, and the Supreme Court Building and discusses their histories and activities. Travels on to visit the Lincoln, Washington, Jefferson, and Vietnam Veterans Memorials.

D1358 YOUNG LINCOLN

DVD, I-S, 27 min, C, IHS, 2005.

"The Early Life of Abraham Lincoln, 1816-1830" - A documentary about Lincoln's Indiana years. Features interviews with noted historians, footage from Lincoln's boyhood home, and narrative excerpts from his writings. Explores the influences in southern Indiana that shaped Lincoln's character and reveals little known stories about this chapter of his life.
